#### COST SECTOR CATERING GOING THROUGH A TOUGH TIME

The latest information kindly provided by Peter Backman of Horizons FS Ltd. shows a depressing state for the contract-catering sector. The problem is spread across all sectors and all temperature regimes. The worst affected area is within the education sector showing total food purchases down by 16.2% in 2007 vs. 2004. Frozen is faring slightly worst than the average at a decline of 18.2%.

The decline in food purchases is absolutely mirrored by the reduction in the number of meals being served. The number of meals served is down by 16.5% in 2007 compared to 2004 and this equates to 67 million meals. The last two years in particular has seen contract caterers pulling out of unprofitable contracts in this sector of the market.

Staff catering and health care frozen foods purchases have both declined by just a little over 2% in 2007 compared to 2004.

The total amount of money being spent on frozen and contract catering is now just a little over £200 million and has declined since 2004 by 6% or £13 million per annum.



- Although only operating out of fewer than 17,000 outlets, the contract catering sector is one of the most important foodservice markets for food suppliers
- This importance arises because of the scale of the companies active in this market and the wide range of food categories that they require
- Despite that, the contract catering sector has seen has a distinct plateauing of its overall outlook over the last few years.
- The 1,200 fall in the number of contracted outlets since 2004 is one example of this

Number of outlets: 2007





- Staff catering otherwise referred to as B&I or Business & Industry is the key sector for contract catering in general. It accounts for almost exactly half of meals served by contract caterers
- Although the B&I share has declined over the last twenty years, over the more recent past it has in fact seen its share grow
- Education has accounted for a declining share as contractors have exited unprofitable contracts in this sector
- There has also been a real, as well as relative, growth in a variety of small sectors combined within the "Others" category

- Fresh food (also called chilled short life food) accounted for a third of purchases in 2007.
- Frozen sales fell by about £13 million in real terms although, actual sales, after adding in price increases, grew over the three year period to 2007.
